Rev. Bill Haley, currently Associate Rector of The Falls Church in Falls Church, VA, and a Senior Fellow with The Washington Institute, is an Anglican priest and spiritual director. His life has been profoundly shaped by many international experiences, particularly in places of deep brokenness in the world, and he has devoted many years to ministering in urban contexts, most recently by being the founder and Rector of St. Brendan's in the City in Washington DC. With his wife Tara (a nurse practitioner) and four kids, he lives at Corhaven, a farm and retreat space in the Shenandoah Valley, offered to help others know the love of God that they might share the His love.

A graduate of Bethel College and Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, Bill previously served as President of The Regeneration Forum and Publisher of Re:Generation Quarterly, a magazine devoted to “community transforming culture.” He also has served on staff at the Servant Leadership School in inner-city Washington, as founding board member and then President of the Southeast DC Partners, and currently is on the board of Samaritan Inns, a leading alcohol and drug rehab program in DC. The author of numerous articles, Bill has also contributed a chapter to *Disorganized Religion: The Evangelization of Youth and Young Adults* (Cowley, 1998). He has compiled several original editions of poetry, prayers, and prose.

His interests include outdoor sports, the visual arts, and music, reading, writing, and long conversations over a good cup of coffee. Most of all, he's excited about spending time with Tara and their children.

Disciplined Order of Christ

The Disciplined Order of Christ (DOC) seeks to help individuals develop Christian maturity, spiritual formation, and what the New Testament speaks of as "the new creation in Christ." (11 Cor. 5: 17)

The Order opens up opportunities for Christians to nurture full, open, authentic, Christ-centered relationships among its members and friends. It encourages a whole-hearted response to the loving presence of the Holy Spirit to discover and share the richest possibilities of life in the Spirit.

Daily Flow

Beginning with Wednesday evening, participants are welcomed into each session with worship through music followed by our guest speakers and group discussion.

Small groups provide a forum for reflecting on the messages offered by the music worship leaders and speakers as well as an environment to lift up prayer concerns.

Our day begins with a Morning Watch, followed by breakfast, a short break and then our worship service beginning at 9 am.

Afternoons are set aside for prayer, devotions, fellowship, workshops and special sessions.

Evening programs begin after dinner and include music, worship and speakers followed by optional opportunities. On Saturday evening following our speaker, a special worship service of communion and healing is held.

The retreat concludes Sunday morning with sharing of joys and breakfast.

Retreat check-in will be 4:00-5:00 pm on **Wednesday, July 13**, followed by dinner at 5:30 pm. A complete retreat schedule will be available upon check-in at Caraway Conference Center.

Morning Watch

Spiritual wake up calls to worship held at 7:00am each morning and led by SE Region DOC members.

Workshops

Afternoon workshops to help us in our Christian walk.

Special presentations by members of the Disciplined Order of Christ to encourage spiritual formation will be offered. Specific workshop topics will be posted at the retreat.

Special Sessions

Special sessions providing opportunities for sharing, fellowship, discussion and joy.
