Robert C. Tannehill grew up in Minnesota and North Dakota, the son of a Methodist pastor. He received his B.A. degree from Hamline University in St. Paul, MN. He then attended Yale Divinity School and Yale University, where he received B.D., M.A., and Ph.D. degrees. He is Professor of New Testament Emeritus at Methodist Theological School in Ohio, Delaware, Ohio, where he taught for thirty-four years. He was also Academic Dean for five years. He retired in 2000 but has taught occasional seminary courses since then.

Dr. Tannehill is the author of eight volumes. He contributed to the development of literary methods of studying New Testament narratives and sayings. His publication that is most relevant to interpreting the Sermon on the Mount is *The Sword of His Mouth: Forceful and Imaginative Language in Synoptic Sayings*. He has written extensively on Luke-Acts as a continuous narrative shaped to impact its readers in particular ways.

At present Robert Tannehill is active in several local ministries to the poor.
